

## Procedure for reporting and for the resolution of problems related with anthropization of places

The problems related with the anthropization of places may include:

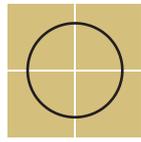
- Architectures and cultural heritage to recover, safeguard and enhance;
- Historical centers, villages and traditional settlements to recover, safeguard and enhance;
- Areas of urban regeneration, providing the recovery and the transformation of degraded urban areas;
- Areas of urban expansion where operate with factors of nature-artifice balance to reduce the environmental impact
- The need to apply the factors of nature-artifice balance on the urban planning of the existing city, metropolis or megalopolis;
- Urban and territorial planning for complex areas;
- Foundation of new towns, cities, metropolis or megacities by government authorities;
- Plans and programs for landscape restoration and enhancement of the territory;
- Plans and programs for the economic development sector, the urban and regional mobility, renewable energy, waste management and territorial nature-artifice balance;
- Recovery and protection of coastal areas, wooded areas, courses and water basins, biotopes and geotopes, natural parks and protected areas in general;
- Activation of all necessary procedures to reduce the phenomena of climate change produced by human activities and anthropization of places;
- Technical, scientific, cultural and communication activities for the development and promotion of the activities of cultural associations;

The reporting of the problem is made by the MEMBER, on a dedicated form, and communicated directly to an Evaluation Commission which oversees the territorial area of reference, be it state or region, in which the problem is detected.

The Evaluation Commission express its opinion about the interest and feasibility of reports collected, classifying and filing them, communicating the results directly to the MEMBER that issued the alert itself.

The MEMBER who issued the alert becomes manager and coordinator of the project that will be developed to solve the problems.

The Evaluation Commission, together with the MEMBER which issued the alert, also involving MEMBERS dealing with disciplines related the problems reported (Finance, Economics, Politics, Climate, Environment, Law, Health Informatization, Communication, etc ... ), according to the set objectives, build up the working group, establishing their professional skills and fees, for the preparation of a project and a feasibility study.



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Depending on the nature of the problems reported and the idea of development that is proposed, two categories of issues are identified with its related Projects and Feasibility

Studies:

A - Projects and feasibility studies with high asset value;

B - Projects and feasibility studies with a high environmental, social and cultural value.

Projects and feasibility studies of the group A, with a high asset value, are financed by subscriptions taken out by INSTITUTIONAL INVESTORS to access the database of Projects and Feasibility Studies made in the Reserved Server.

Projects and feasibility studies of the group B, with high environmental, social and cultural value, are funded by the activity of specific CROWDFUNDING, which is activated simultaneously with the placing on the internet of the specific problem report, with the involvement of global community which will in turn receive a tangible or intangible certificate of the participation in the project.
